RESOURCES

CLEO OUBRE (they/them/she/her) is a Behavioral Health Counselor at APAIT in Garden Grove, Orange County. Cleo is the lead clinician in the Outreach & Engagement (O&E) program at APAIT. O&E provides free mental health services, case management, referrals, workshops, and trainings. Cleo provides short-term individual psychotherapy sessions for clients ages 13 and up, and specifically for LGBTQIA+ individuals. As a black transgender therapist, Cleo understands the importance of addressing mental health and intersecting marginalized identities within therapy. For them, therapy is a collaborative, client-driven process - a process tailored to fit a client's evolving needs. Their role in the therapeutic partnership is to provide support, guidance, and clinical knowledge; and to identify and reflect strengths and capabilities in a nonjudgmental and safer environment. Cleo is interested in supporting the self-actualization and evolution of one's authentic self. Cleo studied psychology and women's and gender studies at Dartmouth College, Hanover, NH for their Bachelor's degree, and they received their Master's degree in social work at Fordham University in New York, NY. Over the past several years, they have worked with the Anti-Violence Project and the Institute for Human Identity in New York City where they provided mental health and social services to the LGBTQIA+ community and HIV-impacted community. Recently, they have worked with SSG Alliance in Los Angeles, providing higher levels of mental health care for individuals with severe and chronic mental illnesses. Cleo has experience working with anxiety, depression, mood disorders, eating disorders, schizophrenia, issues related to gender, sexual and racial identity, sexual and emotional abuse, domestic and intimate partner violence, HIV status, dissociation, childhood trauma, shame and grief."

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ZI TERRENCE-SMITH (they/them) is a passionate, life-long advocate for racial and gender equity. As a Black Radical Womanist, their North Star in community work are the words of Audre Lorde, "I have come to believe over and over again that what is most important to me must be spoken, made verbal and shared, even at the risk of having it bruised or misunderstood." Zi currently works as a Site Director for the Sadie Nash Leadership Project in Brooklyn, NY, where they help equip Black and POC high school aged girls and gender-nonconforming folks with tools to become agents of social change in our world. Outside of work, you can find Zi exploring Brooklyn, playing bass guitar, or watching Westworld.

TOBIAS VASQUEZ (they/them, he/him) was born and raised in North Orange County, mainly in the cities of Anaheim and Fullerton. Their upbringing reflects the struggles of the immigrant, working-class, Chicanx experience in Southern California. Tobias has interests in mental health, positive psychology, intersectional social justice, and Queer art & culture. They have worked for and volunteered for various non-profits and social justice organizations in the East Bay & Orange County. They are also a social sciences scholar with degrees from Fullerton College and UC Berkeley.

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
